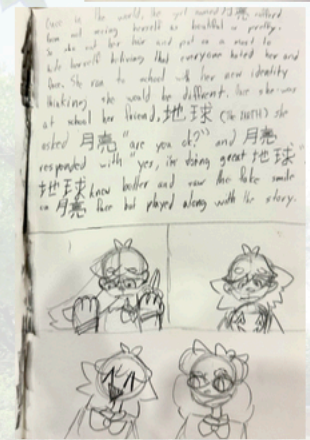
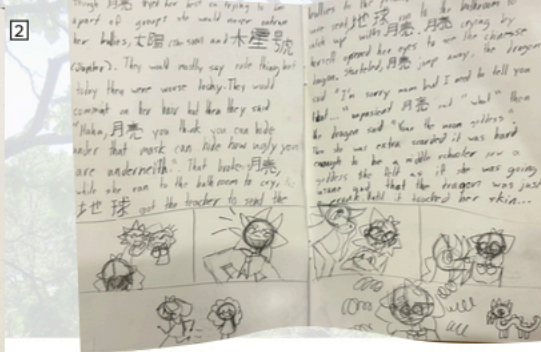


Each summer, students are able to visit Georgia O'Keeffe's Home & Studio located in Abiquiu. While there, they have the opportunity to explore her garden and see her home. Students learn about O'Keeffe's daily life, including her beloved Chow Chows and her struggle with macular degeneration as she grew older. Her home is preserved as she left it, complete with her house plants, a rattlesnake skeleton in the banco, and her vast collection of spices and containers in the pantry.

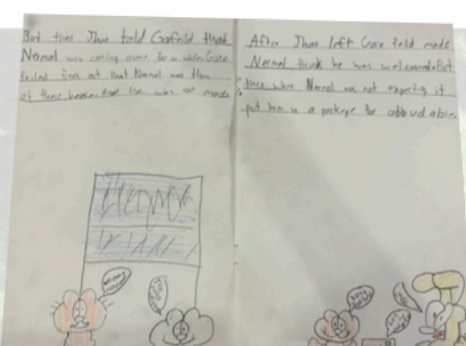
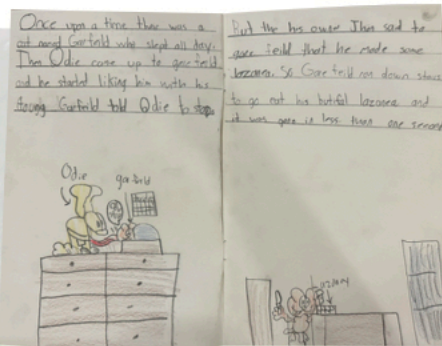
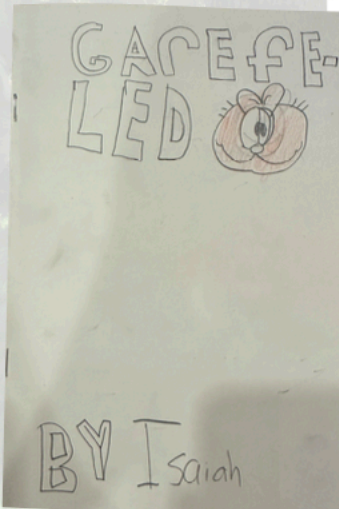




Storytelling with Anoosha!

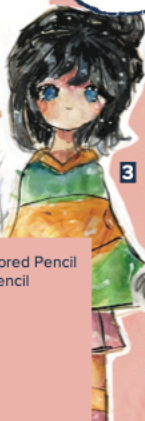

THE LESSON

FOR MY LESSON, STUDENTS LEARNED HOW CHARACTER DESIGNERS USE SHAPE AND COLOR TO CREATE COMPLEX CHARACTERS! STUDENTS LOOKED AT VARIOUS CARTOON CHARACTERS AND IDENTIFIED THE SHAPE USED IN THE DESIGN AS WELL AS THEIR COLORS TO DETERMINE THE PERSONALITY AND HERITAGE OF EACH CHARACTER. As the artist, this painting was inspired by Georgia O’Keeffe’s “Ladder to the Moon” (1958). My painting incorporates a mini-version of O’Keeffe’s work, but in my work the girl climbing up the ladder is physically coming out of the easel on which O’Keeffe’s canvas rests. To me, it symbolizes people emerging as their true selves and reaching higher after seeing her work and experiencing the love she put into her paintings. I personally put a lot of love into this one. I have Georgia O’Keeffe painting Pedernal itself... one of her most famous quotes was, “God told me that if I paint Pedernal enough, it will be mine.”... so, I had her physically painting the mountain she loved. In this painting, I’m doing my own style- the backwards portrait is a new thing I have been experimenting with and that is what is used here. - Una Sundberg

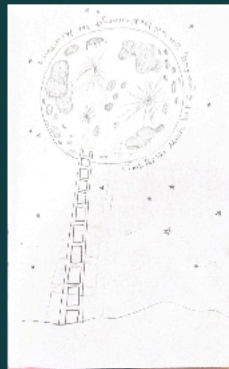

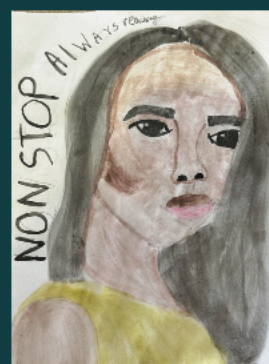
