



Position Title: Art & Leadership Program Internship

Position Summary

This internship aims to provide a variety of experiences in art education, classroom management, and creative opportunities as part of a well-rounded summer program for middle school students. Interns will be trained to work with children on creativity, self-expression, and the development of their artistic talents to enhance their self-confidence and self-respect. Interns will be trained in how to successfully plan lessons and subsequently facilitate artmaking in order to create a positive camp-like experience for middle school youth. Interns act as role models for middle school participants and should conduct themselves accordingly – with enthusiasm for the program, engagement, and respect for other staff and students.

In addition, interns will receive mentoring from select experienced Museum staff (Manager of Youth and Family Learning, Graphic Designer) on putting together an official Art & Leadership Zine for the summer of 2025. This will provide first-hand experience with writing, photography, and art direction.

This internship is 10 weeks in duration from May 27th to August 5th, 2025. This internship is not remote. Applicants must be able to relocate to Santa Fe NM and be able to stay for the entire term of this internship.

Key Learning/Experience for Intern:

- Lesson planning, lesson facilitation, and engagement in a classroom-like setting
- Classroom management
- Coordination, collaboration, and organization in a fast-paced environment
- Art direction, writing, and photography
- Getting to know the ins and outs of how a museum operates as well as meeting with select experienced Museum staff bi-weekly to learn about their job and the industry
